
MIDWEST/SOUTHEAST: December severe weather & tornadoes cause major damage.



EVENT RECAP

- Unseasonably warm and humid conditions created a severe weather flare up across 5 midwestern states on December 10.
- Most damage occurred in Kentucky with record-breaking touchdowns.
- In total over 80 deaths have been reported, 74 in Kentucky.
- One funnel traveled 240 miles surprising meteorologists.
- Mayfield Kentucky & Edwardsville Illinois reporting major damage
- with national media attention and preparedness scrutiny.

According to meteorologists, the southeast is newly prone to severe weather in December, a risk factor that healthcare facilities should prepare for.
